### Message from our president

The Maqasid Institute's core purpose and strategy were central to our efforts in 2024. Our deeper "why" is to recognize that knowing Allah SWT and connecting with His Revelation and Divine guidance is the most profound experience and goal we can aspire to serve. The maqasid approach and all the scholarship, research, and educational efforts around it represent a significant starting point on the journey we invite everybody to take. This is a journey to realize the Revelation in our lives and to make a powerful and beneficial impact in today's world. With this deeper sense of purpose, we developed a new strategy, reorganized, and refocused our efforts.

However, modern academia, especially in the field of Islamic studies, faces significant challenges. Issues such as imitation, fragmentation of knowledge, lack of critical thinking, use of contradictory sources in research, and a lack of holistic vision based on the Revelation are prevalent. The Maqasid Institute addresses these problems by promoting a comprehensive and interconnected understanding of knowledge guided by divine Revelation.

Throughout 2024, we have reached over 20,000 individuals through our expanded social media efforts and engaged over 2,500 learners globally through our educational programs and training events, expanding our reach and deepening our impact. The Maqasid Institute's unique educational pedagogy lies in the combined reading of *Kitab Al-Wahy* (Revealed Book) and *Kitab Al-Kawn* (Book of Nature), using a unique methodology to offer holistic solutions to contemporary challenges. Our courses, such as Islamic Psychology from the Perspective of the Maqasid Methodology and Re-imagining Economics: Transdisciplinary Approach, were designed to promote critical thinking and real-life application and offer radically better alternatives to the status quo in these disciplines. These initiatives are not just educational; they are transformative, equipping individuals with the tools to navigate and contribute positively to the world.

Our Maqasid Network today boasts nearly 1,400 members, and our Journal of Contemporary Maqasid Studies has attracted 15,000 unique visitors, generating 5,000 downloads. These numbers are not just statistics; they represent lives touched, minds enlightened, and communities strengthened. In 2024, we published numerous scholarly articles, held regular forums to discuss contemporary issues through the lens of Maqasid, and collaborated with global scholars to produce beneficial knowledge. This dedication to scholarship ensures that our work remains at the forefront of Islamic thought and practice.

Looking ahead, our strategic plan for 2024-2028 focuses on sustaining and expanding our efforts. We aim to further our mission by nurturing our global research network, enhancing our educational programs, and solidifying our role in beneficial knowledge production. Together, let us continue to strive for a world enriched by divine guidance, where every individual is empowered to lead, learn, and live in the light of Revelation.

The Magasid Institute (MI) is a non-profit educational and research organization. We believe that through a comprehensive and purposeful reading of the Revelation, the Quran, and the Sunnah of the Prophet Muhammad, as well as the whole universe, we can better understand our world and our role in it. We seek the wisdom of the Revelation through research and education, focusing on how we are connected, thrive together, and build a just, wise, and compassionate world. The Institute is based in the USA and operates globally through a network of independent researchers, offices, and partner organizations.

### Vision

### Mission

### Year in Review 2024

In 2024, the Maqasid Institute made significant progress in education, research, and partnerships, aligning divine guidance with contemporary global challenges. This year, our initiatives in education have broadened in scope and deepened in impact, demonstrating our commitment to disseminating knowledge rooted in the Revelation and the Book of Nature. Here is how we have made a difference:

### Education

Building on the momentum from 2023, MI continued to expand its general and graduate education programs, introducing innovative courses and flexible learning models while fostering collaborations with academic institutions globally.

### New Key Programs and Achievements:



Islamic Psychology from the Perspective of the Maqasid Methodology: Part of the Islamic Psychology Research Network (IPRN), this course attracted global participants, academics, and practitioners, providing insights into applying the Maqasid Methodology to mental health and human behavior.

**Re-imagining Economics: Transdisciplinary Approach:** This course explored economic phenomena through an Islamic lens, promoting new paradigms and solutions rooted in Maqasid principles. The course is based on Maqasid Methodology, and it was an attempt at redefining the vision of economics and finance from a phenomena-based transdisciplinary perspective.






**Essence of Islamic Civilization:** this course highlighted the holistic nature of the Islamic civilization that had achieved previously unprecedented advancements in science, engineering, architecture, and medicine, all due to human ingenuity, openness, and motivation that stems from Allah's command "Read!" This course affirmed that the essence of the Islamic civilization is Tawheed (monotheism).

**Reading the Book of Nature:** this course offered insights into the divine design within nature, enriching participants' appreciation for creation and fostering a holistic understanding of environmental stewardship.



### Core Program:







Maqasid Methodology Course: This cornerstone program welcomed its fifth cohort in May, enhancing participants' understanding of Maqasid principles. The course was praised for its integration of theory and practical applications.

Magasid Approach to Hadith Course: It is a MOOC-based This foundational course. course in Hadith aims to equip students with basic concepts and methodological tools for understanding and engaging with the Sunnah. The focus will be on key concepts and issues in Hadith studies, along with a brief exploration of the most important sources for Hadith documentation.

Nizam Al-Qur'an course: This is a MOOC-based course. This course introduces Nizam Al-Qur'an and its role in understanding the meanings and objectives of the Qur'an. Ιt also clarifies misconceptions held by some scholars of jurisprudence and exegesis, reveals the objectives and principles of Islamic law in light of the Quran, and uncovers the knowledge and sciences embedded in the Quranic structure.

### Achievements in Education:

- The introduction of self-paced learning formats for key courses enables flexibility and deeper engagement.
- Over 100 on-site lectures delivered by our scholars in East Asia, Southeast Asia, South Asia, Central Asia, West Asia, Europe, North Africa, and North America.
- Our online and on-site events reached an audience of over 10,000 worldwide over the past two years.

### Research

In 2024, our research initiatives aimed to produce beneficial knowledge, providing a deeper understanding of Allah's revealed guidance and its practical application in today's world. Key activities included:

### Publication of Scholarly Articles and Books:

MI-affiliated scholars have continued to contribute to the field of Islamic studies through extensive publications in journals and books. Here are just a few examples of what our scholars have written about:



- Dr. Jamila Tilout provided an insightful discussion answering the question of "Is Today's Family Perishing?" in JCMS, vol.3, no.2.
- Dr. Mowloud Mohadi and Dr. Yasser Tarshani discussed the ethics of AI through the lens of Magasid Al-Shari'ah in JCMS, vol.2, no.2.
- Dr. Ildus Rafikov discussed the issues of epistemology and the integration of knowledge from the Islamic perspective in two separate publications issued in Azerbaijan and Kazakhstan.

### Magasid Research Forums:









Regular forums were held to discuss contemporary issues through the lens of Maqasid, involving scholars from around the globe. To date, 20 online Research Forum lectures were delivered by experts in various fields of knowledge. Notable among speakers were the following:

- Prof. Dr. Ibrahim Ozdemir (Turkiye) discussed the concept of Mizan (balance) in relation to global environmental challenges and how environmental protection constitutes one of the aims of the Shari'ah.
- Dr. Baptiste Brodard (Switzerland) presented his research on welfare social services and human dignity from the Islamic perspective.
- Dr. Daud Batchelor (Australia) discussed Islamic Wellbeing Index for Muslim countries.

- Prof. Dr. Akhmetova (Russia) presented her research on the methodology of Musa Jarullah Bigiev (d.1949) in interpreting the Qur'an.
- Dr. Ildus Rafikov discussed reimagining the study of economic phenomena using the Maqasid methodology.
- Mr. Qanit Khalilullah (Pakistan) presented his study on full reserve banking to eliminate inflation, public debt, and unemployment.
- And lastly, Dr. Jamila Tilout discussed whether there is a paradigm shift in Maqasid studies.

### Achievements in Research:









Publication of 28 articles in JCMS

Topics covering a wide range of issues, from Blockchain and cryptocurrencies to Islamic history, Islamic psychology and education 26 blog articles in two languages

### Offices and Partnerships

The Maqasid Institute's strategic collaborations in 2024 demonstrated our commitment to expanding the reach and depth of revelation-inspired education and research:

- Collaboration with Al-Balkhi Institute and International Students of Islamic Psychology (ISIP): Through this partnership we managed to offer a new course in Islamic psychology and are planning on joint research initiatives.
- Partnership with Hearts SEE: Focused on exposing students and scholars to nature and its language and how to understand environmental issues from an Islamic perspective.
   To do that, we have collaboratively introduced the course titled "Reading the Book of Nature" with Shaikh Muhammad Foulds.
- Collaboration with Istanbul Foundation for Science and Culture (IFSC): Istanbul Foundation for Science and Culture is dedicated to organizing intellectual, academic, social, and cultural activities that seek to address the challenges confronting the modern world, with a particular focus on the crisis of faith. MI is set to collaborate with IFSC to promote understanding, enlightenment, and solutions to the crisis of faith through joint projects in research and education.
- Partnership with Research Synergy Foundation (RSF): Research Synergy Foundation, an Indonesia-based digital social enterprise, has established a vast research ecosystem connecting hundreds of educational institutions, thousands of researchers, and numerous scientific journals while also organizing various scientific conferences. The Maqasid Institute aims to integrate into this ecosystem to explore Maqasid-oriented projects.
- Partnership with RAISSE Foundation: Our scholars have been invited to advise this
  group of professional, passionate Muslims dedicated to the revival of Islamic Civilization
  to elevate humanity. MI stands to advise this Registered UK Non-Profit Company and
  guide their staff through our courses.

### Magasid Institute Malaysia - Contributions:





- Seminars and Workshops on Maqasid Shariah in Governance: These events, co-organized with local and governmental bodies, focused on integrating Islamic principles into policy-making and public governance.
- **Tazkirah Ramadan Series:** Featured sessions on spiritual purification and the universal mercy of Islam, drawing connections to the objectives of Shariah.

### Key Initiatives by MIM:

### 1. Magasid Shariah Index Development

MI Malaysia collaborated with Lembaga Tabung Haji to develop an index integrating magasid principles into organizational policies and global ESG frameworks.

### 2. Policy and Governance Workshops

A three-day workshop co-organized with JAKIM introduced magasid-based tools to 50 government officials, enhancing policy-making processes.

### 3. Islamic Finance Training

Specialized training on Fiqh al-Muwazanat and Ma'alat principles targeted regulators and practitioners, ensuring Shariah-compliant and socially beneficial financial practices.

### Magasid Institute Indonesia - Contributions:



- Bi-monthly Maqasid Seminars: These seminars targeted our Indonesian members and aimed at enhancing their understanding of the Maqasid methodology and its application among academic members and postgraduate students.
- Journal of Contemporary Maqasid Studies: Members of MI Indonesia were closely involved with managing the journal, especially with regard to editing work, IT support, and layout.

#### Magasid Institute India - Contributions:

- Webinars on Maqasid Methodology: A dedicated session focusing on the introduction to Maqasid methodology, organized in collaboration with Dr. Jasser Auda. This webinar specifically engaged students from As-Salam Islamic College, promoting the foundational understanding of Maqasid Methodology.
- Three-Month Course: Conducted a three-month program titled Introduction to Maqasid al-Shari'ah, which provided in-depth learning opportunities for participants interested in understanding the principles and applications of Maqasid.
- **Student Gatherings and Discussions:** Regular gatherings with university students to explore contemporary trends in Maqasid al-Shari'ah and its future prospects. These

discussions served as a platform for mutual learning and exchanging ideas, strengthening our connections with young minds.


Maqasid Institute Sri-Lanka - Contributions:

### Business Model and Financial Sustainability

In 2024, the Maqasid Institute took significant steps to strengthen its business model and ensure financial sustainability, guided by the strategic recommendations outlined in 2023 and incorporated into the *Maqasid Institute Strategy 2024-2028*. By focusing on educational services, diversifying fundraising streams, reorganizing, downsizing, social media reach, partnerships, and institutional development capability, we achieved notable progress while laying the groundwork for future growth.

### Strategic Recommendations in Action

The recommendations made by the Institutional Development Committee—focusing on educational services, simplifying our messaging, promoting a higher level of "why", appropriate pricing, and targeting English-speaking markets—yielded tangible successes this year.

- Educational Focus: We successfully delivered four major courses: Reimagining Economics & Finance, Reading the Book of Nature, Essence of Islamic Civilization, and Maqasid Methodology for Islamic Psychology. These programs attracted approximately 150 students, generating significant interest and positive feedback. Efforts where also put into offering more on-demand self-paced courses.
- **Pricing Structure**: With fees ranging between US\$25 -100 per participant, educational revenues met the 2024 target of \$8,000.
- Target Markets: Educational and social media outreach efforts were concentrated on English-speaking audiences, primarily in the US, UK, and Canada, where interest in our courses grew steadily.

While the implementation of short, intensive programs for general education was delayed, these are planned as a priority for 2025. Additionally, we are advancing discussions with potential partners, such as the *Center for Muslim Christian Studies (CMCS Houston)*, to offer graduate-level courses like "Methodologies of Interpreting the Qur'an," launching in January 2025.

### Fundraising Strategies: A Work in Progress

Diversifying and strengthening our funding base remains a key priority for the institute. Although significant progress has been made with regard to rebranding, pitch & persona, donor targeting, support case, donor life-cycle, communication, and alignment of activities, additional efforts are required to meet our financial goals.

- 1. **Major Donors**: While this approach remains under development, two long-term major donors continue to sustain our operations. We aim to expand this support base, with a targeted goal of raising \$150,000, about double the current level.
- 2. **Medium Donors**: In 2024, a single project (*Reimagining Economics and Finance*) attracted \$10,000. Moving forward, we will actively engage mid-income professionals to broaden this donor category.
- 3. **Grassroots Support**: Revenue from courses and soft fundraising efforts brought in approximately \$9,000 this year. While community-based programs were limited, our expanded educational initiatives for 2025 will incorporate grassroots engagement to build a wider support network.

### 2025 Fundraising Targets:

• \$150,000 incrementally over 2024's level.

Maqasid Institute staff are currently enrolled in a fundraising training program. They actively consult top professionals to strengthen the case for support, planning, logistics, and outreach efforts to ensure the institute's long-term financial stability.

#### **Education Service Revenues**

Revenue from educational programs met expectations, reaching \$8,000 in 2024, largely due to strong enrollment in key courses. Notably, the *Maqasid Methodology for Islamic Psychology* course was oversubscribed, demonstrating a growing demand for our educational offerings.

In 2025, we project moderate yet sustainable growth, with revenues expected to reach \$15,000. This will be supported by expanding course offerings—across online, blended, self-paced, synchronous, and asynchronous formats—to better serve diverse learners worldwide.

### **Grants and Project-Specific Funding**

Grants remain an essential pillar of MI's financial strategy. In 2024, specific-purpose grants, such as *Reimagining Economics and Finance*, were critical in sustaining research activities. Moving forward, we will actively seek additional grants to fund strategic projects, including economics research, public policy, and tafsir-related initiatives.

## Budget

The budget for 2025 includes an emphasis on networking activities to build stronger awareness and partnerships for the institute in the target audience areas.

### Looking Ahead: Plans for 2025

As we step into 2025, the Maqasid Institute remains committed to our mission of realizing divine guidance through education, research, and action. Building on the strategic directions outlined in the "MI Strategy 2024-2028" and reflecting on the achievements of the past year, we are excited to unveil our plans for expanding our educational offerings, deepening our research initiatives, and strengthening our global partnerships.

### Strategic Objectives 2024-2028









Our strategic priorities for the next five-year timeframe revolve around:

- 1. Education: Establishing the Maqasid Institute as a leading provider of holistic Maqasid-based and revelation-driven Islamic education that promotes critical thinking and real-life application.
- 2. Research: Promoting a Revelation-driven paradigm shift in education and research towards purposefulness, connectivity, and holism through the Maqasid Methodology.
- 3. Networking: Energizing and expanding our global research network by fostering collaboration among scholars and professionals to facilitate knowledge exchange and promote joint research initiatives.
- 4. Partnership: Develop strategic partnerships with educational institutions, research centers, and civil society organizations that share our commitment to a holistic, revelation-driven approach.

### **Educational Initiatives**

### 1. Short intensive learning modules

Among the strategic priorities of MI is to offer intensive short courses that bring a fresh Maqasidi perspective to areas like education, psychology, ecology, and economics. These courses tackle real-world challenges and opportunities, helping participants think with purpose, stay connected, and see the bigger picture—all while grounding everything in an Islamic worldview. With a phenomena-based approach, they'll help participants ask the right questions and find practical, Revelation-centered solutions for personal and community challenges.

### 2. Experiential Learning

In partnership with the Istanbul Foundation for Science and Culture (IFSC) and Hearts SEE, we are thrilled to announce a 7-day nature retreat in Turkiye based on the "Reading the Book of Nature" course. This immersive experience will be led by MI scholars like Shaikh Muhammad Foulds from Hearts SEE (UK), and scholars from IFSC. Participants will engage in hands-on learning about navigating forests and understanding the language of nature, drawing parallels with reading and interpreting Revelation.

### 3. Connecting with the Quran

In collaboration with the Center for Muslim Christian Studies (CMCS) Houston, we will offer a new course titled "Hermeneutical Methodologies for Interpreting the Qur'an: From the Classical Islamic Period to the Contemporary Context." This course will consist of two modules, focusing on classical and contemporary approaches to Qur'anic exegesis, facilitating a deep dialogue across faith traditions.

### 4. Expansion of Existing Courses

In 2025, the Maqasid Institute will broaden the scope of our educational programs to address contemporary challenges across disciplines, including economics, environmental stewardship, psychology, and interfaith studies. Emphasizing both the theoretical foundations and practical applications of the Maqasid Methodology, we will expand course delivery modes to include online, self-paced, blended, and flexible synchronous and asynchronous formats. This diversified approach ensures greater accessibility, allowing learners worldwide to engage with our programs in ways that suit their needs and schedules.

### Research and Scholarly Initiatives

### 1. Journal of Contemporary Magasid Studies (JCMS)

We aim to enhance the scope and impact of JCMS by continuing our collaboration with the Research Synergy Foundation, especially over holding conferences. This partnership will help attract a diverse array of researchers and enhance the quality and reach of our publications.

### 2. Monthly Research Forums

Our monthly forums have become a vital platform for academic discourse and will continue to feature distinguished speakers from around the globe. These forums are crucial in sustaining academic discussions and highlighting state-of-the-art research within Magasid studies in both English and Arabic.

#### 3. Quarterly Magasid Methodology Seminar

Beginning in 2025, the Maqasid Institute will initiate a series of quarterly seminars focused on the Maqasid Methodology. These seminars are designed to support the ongoing research efforts of our Maqasid Network members. Through these targeted sessions, we aim to deepen members' understanding of the Maqasid Methodology and enhance their ability to apply these principles in their diverse research projects effectively. Each seminar will provide a platform for interactive learning, discussion, and troubleshooting, ensuring that our network members are well-equipped to advance their research with rigor and insight.

#### 4. Book Publication

We are excited to support the publication of a new book by Prof. Dr. Basma Abdelgafar, which is expected to contribute significantly to contemporary Islamic scholarship and its practical applications.

### 5. Blog Articles Publication

We will continue to attract Maqasid staff members, as well as the Maqasid Network members to publish their insights as short weekly articles on our website in two languages, Arabic and English.

### Partnerships and Collaborative Projects

### Continued Global Engagement

Our commitment to nurturing and expanding partnerships will see us engaging more actively in conferences and joint programs, both academic and general. This includes deepening ties with existing partners and exploring new collaborations that align with our vision of revelation-driven life, learning, and leadership.

### • Strategic Collaborations for Course Development

We will continue to work closely with global educational institutions to develop and deliver courses that integrate the Maqasid methodology, enhancing both the depth and accessibility of Islamic scholarship, in partnership with IFSC, Hearts SEE, CMCSH, and the Advanced Education Training Institute in Indonesia.

### Social Media and Outreach Expansion
