ABOUT MI

The Maqasid Institute (MI) is a non-profit educational and research organization. We believe that Revelation, the Quran and the Sunnah, hold the key to understanding our world, each other, and our role in it. We seek the wisdom of Revelation through research and education, focusing on how we are connected, can thrive together, and build a just, wise, and compassionate world. The Institute is based in the USA and operates globally through a network of independent researchers and partner organizations.

At the heart of Maqasid Institute's programming is a methodology that has been developed to harness the wisdom of the Quran and Sunnah to address contemporary challenges across diverse fields. YEAR IN REVIEW

Impact

By the grace of Allah, in 2023, the Maqasid Institute (MI) saw a robust continuation of its activities in research, education, and community outreach. A growing number of participants in its various activities, such as the Maqasid Methodology course, the Qur'an Reflection program, and Maqasid Approach to Hadith, Nizam Al-Qur'an (Order of the Quran), as well as the Research Forums and publication of the Journal of Contemporary Maqasid Studies, serve as evidence of success of the Institute in promoting the Maqasid Methodology in Islamic scholarship and positively influencing interested individuals and organizations throughout the globe. Maqasid Institute is at the forefront of intellectual renewal by addressing pressing challenges in Islamic scholarship and contemporary phenomena.

Empowerment of Muslim women was a critical area for Maqasid Institute in 2023. Our educational programs, research projects, conferences, and seminar presentations led by Dr. Basma Abdelgafar and Dr. Sanja Bilic had a great impact on women and girls on three continents - Singapore, Ireland, Bosnia & Herzegovina, and Qatar.

Apart from our educational courses and research-related activities, our scholars and team members have visited several countries and organizations in the USA, East Asia, South-East Asia, and Central Asia. Prof. Jasser Auda and Dr. Zaid Barzinji visited South Korea, the Philippines, Indonesia, and Malaysia in July. They carried a packed schedule of events with Islamic organizations. Dr. Basma Abdelgafar completed her 3-module course on "Purposefulness, Connectivity and Holism" at Ma'ahaduna (Hayaa Network) Singapore and participated in a number of conferences and seminars in Europe and the Middle East. Dr. Ildus Rafikov presented the Maqasid Methodology and related ideas about knowledge and worldview during IIIT Summer schools in Kyrgyzstan and Azerbaijan and during the 6th CIS Muslim Scholars' Forum in Istanbul, Türkiye. Last but certainly not least, Dr. Motaz Althaher was invited by Maqasid Institute India and presented his ideas on Maqasidi thinking at Al-Jamia Al-Islamia in Delhi. The event was convened by Jamaat-e-Islami Hind and the Students Islamic Organization of India.

It is important to note that the ideas advanced by the Maqasid Institute continue to be in high demand in many jurisdictions around the world and are talked about among scholars and students. Throughout 2023, the Maqasid Institute worked to inspire researchers, postgraduate students, established scholars, and practitioners via our courses, talks, seminars, and forums with the active participation of MI members or via our online resources, printed materials, and social media. The institute's work impacted thousands of participants in our courses, research forums, and events organized by MI partners around the world. In addition to participants or attendees, there is an immeasurable impact of the MI's ideas on learners who want to understand and apply the divine guidance contained in the Book of Allah and the Sunnah of His Messenger and put this knowledge into practice in their respected fields, such as psychology, economics, politics, and in Islamic studies. The following presentation of our programs and activities will provide a glimpse of the Institute's activities in 2023.




Programs & Activities

Magasid Institute Global

2023 saw Maqasid Institute Global weaving a vibrant tapestry of knowledge and engagement across the globe. Guided by the principles of purposefulness, connectivity, and holism in research, education, and action, we served the Ummah through diverse initiatives that promoted Islamic scholarship and fostered intellectual exchange.

Magasid Institute Study of the Qur'an (MISQ) Project



The Maqasid Institute Study of the Qur'an Project (MISQ Project), launched in 2020, continues its ambitious journey towards a comprehensive Maqasid-based tafsir of the Qur'an. Envisioned as an eight-volume undertaking, the project has already produced four volumes. Completion is projected for 2027.

Guided by the principles of purposefulness, interconnectedness, and holism, the MISQ Project seeks to overcome the problems of imitation, fragmentation, and partialism that often define modern Qur'anic scholarship. The tafsir delves into the Qur'an's inherent logic of purposefulness and connectivity, revealing its seamless integration of knowledge and its connection to the universe itself.

This methodology, rooted in the Maqasid framework, places revelation at the heart of knowledge, emphasizing purposeful linkages and the centrality of the Qur'anic Arabic. Looking at past, present, and future through a Qur'anic lens, the MISQ Project aspires to provide a foundational understanding for achieving Islamic renewal.

Beyond its written form, the project embraces diverse avenues for dissemination and engagement. A dedicated website houses the tafsir in print, audio, and video formats, while an e-learning platform facilitates learning at various levels. Social media

and media tools further broaden the project's reach, offering bite-sized content and fostering discussion and application across various academic disciplines.

In 2023, the project witnessed significant milestones. Volumes 3 and 4 were completed, while collaborations with the Muslim Association of Canada and the Islamic Institute of Toronto brought Surah Al-Imran to a wider audience. Notably, lectures on the Maqasid methodology and its application to Tafsir were delivered at esteemed institutions like the University of Montreal, the University of Toronto, the University of George Mason, and other universities during the East and South-East Asia tour.

As the MISQ Project progresses toward its intended completion in 2027, we remain dedicated to enriching Islamic thought and understanding, challenging the status quo, fostering intellectual resistance, and contributing to a holistic interpretation of the divine message for the benefit of humanity and the Ummah.






2023 marked a year of impactful strides for Maqasid Institute, with a singular focus: empowering women globally. This report traces our journey, from the initial spark of the Centre for Women and Policy Alternatives (CWPA) to the strategic pivot back towards education, all while witnessing the transformative power of Maqasid-based knowledge in the lives of Muslim women.

Our year began with igniting sparks of self-discovery. Dr. Basma Abdelgafar's workshop in Ireland empowered young girls to understand their identity through the lens of Quranic women, instilling a sense of ownership and responsibility. This spirit of empowerment resonated with Dr. Basma's insightful talk at Shahid Beheshti University about Muhammad Abdullah Draz's study of morality in the Qur'an.

February 2023 witnessed a significant milestone with Dr. Sanja Bilic joining the Maqasid Institute. Her expertise in policy and leadership proved invaluable in crafting the vision for CWPA, an initiative dedicated to addressing critical issues faced by Muslim women globally. Dr. Bilic's tireless efforts, including expert consultations, needs assessments, and proposal development, laid a solid foundation for this groundbreaking initiative. We also actively participated in international forums, such as the consultation on the protection of women in forced displacement, organized by the University of Birmingham, and the QF Women's Summit, where Dr. Basma and Dr. Sanja presented on crucial topics related to public policy and creating new spaces for Muslim women.

Magasid Institute Education







Our Maqasid Methodology course, which is Phase 1 of the 3-Phase Maqasid Fellowship Program introduced in 2022, empowered nearly 150 learners with this transformative paradigm. By year's end, we celebrated the graduation of our fourth cohort, equipping them to apply the Maqasid principles in their fields and communities.

Expanding our educational offerings, we introduced two courses in Arabic language: "Nizam Al-Qur'an" and "Maqasid Approach to Hadith." These MOOC-style courses, led by renowned scholars from India and Syria, provide deeper engagement with the Qur'an and Sunnah. Over sixty participants joined the two courses in Arabic.





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Marking a significant milestone, we also launched the Qur'an Reflection Program, Phase 2 of the Maqasid Fellowship Program. Close to 100 participants from around the world embarked on a

seven-month journey of personal reflection and scholarly discourse, facilitated by Dr. Motaz Al-Thaher and led by Prof. Jasser Auda and Dr. Basma Abdelgafar. Monthly online sessions and discussions fostered vibrant engagement with the Quran's divine message, culminating in insightful final assignments that showed the transformative power of Magasid-based interpretation.

Furthermore, MI successfully delivered the Maqasid program in Singapore, delving deeper into the transformative principles of purposefulness, connectivity, and holism. The program's success in Singapore and the positive response from participants solidified our commitment to expanding it to other locations in the nearest future. The curriculum development for the "Maqasidi Thinking and Living Program" is a cornerstone of our efforts. We aim to equip participants with the knowledge and confidence to navigate their lives through the lens of authentic Islam. A structured Qur'an reading program, Q&A forums, and safe space discussions are being meticulously planned to foster a vibrant online community of active Muslim women.

It's a shift in the paradigm of my in learning, Alhamdhulillah. The work of Dr Jasser Auda has opened the gateway of ljithad into new dimensions with the basic framework of Quran and Hadees and with the seven elements, webs of maeanings, purpose and cycles of reflection. The Shaikh makes new roads into the thinking coupling Quran and Sunnah with all other studies that each of it complement the other.

I was a learner in the second cohort of the Maqasid Methodology course. The Maqasid Methodology is highly transformative vis-à-vis our outlook on humanity, the cosmos and, more importantly, our understanding of the divine message. Being a revelation-centric methodology, it leads one to understand the issues facing humanity from the perspective of the Qur'an and Sunnah. Moreover, it inculcates in its learners the spirit of critical inquiry rooted in the revelation. I think the Maqasid Methodology is not only the pressing need of the hour, but it is also promising for long overdue ijtihad regarding which the Muslim ummah is obliged.





The great value in the work of the Maqasid Institute, and in the Maqasid Methodology course in particular, is its emphasis on returning to our core scriptural sources - the Qur'an and the Sunnah. It is my personal conviction that this is the call of the hour. Our community needs to reorient itself to its sources - God and His Prophet (s) through the mediums each has left us - the Quran and the Sunnah. The Maqasid Methodology is a coherent framework and system, possibly the only one explicated in this way, that allows us to interact with our sources directly and with a way to approach it which is both contemporary and authentic. I pray that God gives Sh. Jasser a long life and that the Maqasid Institute and its team serve their vision and mission.

Embarking on the journey through the Maqasid Methodology third cohort has been truly transformative. The depth of knowledge and wisdom shared by the instructors has enriched my understanding of Islamic principles and their real-world applications. The structured approach of the program has empowered me to navigate complex challenges while staying true to the core values of Islam. I am grateful for the opportunity to be part of this cohort and highly recommend the Maqasid Methodology to anyone seeking a profound connection between faith and action.





Magasid Institute Research

Our commitment to research became more pronounced through the monthly Research Forums. Scholars from Australia, Mauritius, Indonesia, the UK, Switzerland, Jordan, and Malaysia presented their advanced research, showcasing diverse applications of the Maqasidi approach in fields ranging from Islamic studies to sociology, psychology, and finance. These forums served as fertile ground for scholarly exchange and intellectual exploration, pushing the boundaries of Maqasid-inspired knowledge production.



The Journal of Contemporary Maqasid Studies (JCMS), led by Editor-in-Chief Dr. Jamila Tilout, deputy Editor-in-Chief Dr. Mowloud Mohadi, and the Managing Editor, Dr. Zaid Barzinji, continued to attract scholars who submitted their articles for publication in the two issues. This year, volume one focused on the fundamentals of Tafsīr (*Uṣūl Al-Tafsīr*), presenting works on contemporary advancements in the field of Tafsir and its methodologies. Volume two focused on contemporary realities in the light of the Magasid Al-Shari'ah. This volume presented

discussions on the ethics of artificial intelligence, how to view the present reality from the Magasidi lens, and how the Magasidi ideas are connected to phenomenology.

The MI's Artificial Intelligence Research Group, headed by Mohammed Belyamani and Dr. Fareed Malik, embarked on a series of workshops on generative Al prompting. The workshop was attended by a small group of MRN members, who in the span of several weeks, learned how to use the newly developed science of prompting to generate better Al responses. Knowledge gained during the workshops helped advance ideas for academic research and writing.



Among notable achievements of MI in the area of partnerships and research is the creation of the Islamic Psychology Research Network (IPRN) designed as a platform for research in psychology using the Maqasid methodology. IPRN, which is the joint project between MI, Al-Balkhi Institute, and International Students of Islamic Psychology (ISIP), has attracted some of the top thinkers in the field (e.g. Prof. Dr. Ghulam H. Rassool, Prof. Dr. Bagus Riyono), who are currently preparing a customized Maqasid Methodology course with special emphasis on Islamic psychology. This course and other related scholarly activities are expected to lead to knowledge production in the form of research projects, guidelines, and audio/video materials for practitioners of Islamic psychology.

The Economics and Finance Research Group had several discussions at the beginning of the year but mostly stayed dormant. The new group management has embarked on a robust planning process for 2024 and is specifically engaged in preparing the customized Maqasid Methodology course, the Qur'an reflection, and other economics-related discussions among group members.



Amplifying Voices

Beyond formal programs, we facilitated knowledge sharing through our monthly newsletter and a platform for established and emerging scholars to share their insights on diverse topics in the form of blog articles. These blog articles, unified by the Maqasid thinking, fostered public discourse and challenged conventional paradigms, reminding us of the transformative potential of purposefulness, connectivity, and holism.

Global Re-envisioning

Our dedication to "Re-envisioning Islamic Scholarship" extended beyond the virtual realm. Through visits to various countries, including South Korea, the Philippines, India, Malaysia, Indonesia, Azerbaijan, Kyrgyzstan, and Qatar, we fostered collaboration and dialogue with leading academic institutions and organizations. These exchanges served as catalysts for future partnerships and initiatives, paving the way for a more vibrant and inclusive Islamic intellectual landscape.

Reflecting on 2023, we are grateful for the countless individuals who have contributed to our journey. From our dedicated team and esteemed faculty to our passionate learners and engaged partners, we stand together in a shared commitment to illuminating the path toward a more just, interconnected, and purpose-driven world. We look forward to the next chapter, eager to continue weaving our tapestry of knowledge and inspiring future generations to embrace the transformative power of the Maqasid.







Activities at Independent Magasid Institute Offices

MI India



MI India facilitated wider access to Maqasidi scholarship by translating and publishing Prof. Jasser Auda's seminal work, "Re-envisioning Islamic Scholarship," in Urdu. Dr. Enayatullah Subhani's groundbreaking course, "Nizam Al-Qur'an" offered scholars and enthusiasts a deep dive into the Quran's intricate methodology. The publication of a landmark book on Dr. Mohammad Nejatullah Siddiqi enriched Islamic intellectual discourse.

Beyond translations, MI India advanced vibrant intellectual exchange through impactful programs. Dr. Motaz Al-Thaher's visit sparked stimulating discussions on Islamic thought and contemporary issues among students, scholars, and leaders. Prof. Jasser Auda and Director of MI India Zulqernain Subhani's insightful lectures and workshops deepened the participants' understanding of contemporary Islamic disciplines through the lens of Maqasid Methodology.

Collaboration played a key role in MI India's success. Fruitful discussions with Indian researchers laid the groundwork for future collaborative endeavors, while regular meetings within the MI India community ensured alignment and collective progress. These initiatives, along with scholarly translations and impactful programs, solidified MI India's role in advancing Islamic scholarship and nurturing a vibrant intellectual landscape in 2023.



MI Malaysia







Maqasid Institute Malaysia (MIM) dedicated 2023 to promoting Maqasid understanding and establishing a solid Maqasid research culture within Malaysia. Leveraging online platforms, translations, and workshops, MIM engaged academics, researchers, and the public alike.

Highlighting this commitment, MIM hosted the MI Global Executive Team, facilitating valuable meetings with influential Islamic organizations. Prof. Dr. Jasser Auda and Dr. Barzinji engaged with the International Institute of Advanced Islamic Studies (IAIS), Institute for Islamic Understanding (IKIM), and the Ministry of Religious Affairs (JAKIM), reaching numerous distinguished officials, including Senator Dato' Dr. Haji Mohd Na'im bin Haji Mokhtar, the political secretary Dr. Razak Idris, the chief Judge of Syariah Court Dato Mohd Amran Bin Mat Zain.

Collaboration was further amplified at sessions with universities and organizations like the International Islamic University Malaysia and its related institutes and faculties like ISTAC and IRKHS, Kolej Darul Hikmah, Muslim Youth Organization of Malaysia (ABIM), and IIIT South-East Asia. Notably, a dedicated meeting with MI Global solidified plans for joint research and educational initiatives in Malaysia.

MIM's research contribution was evident in Prof. Dr. Zulkifli Hassan's groundbreaking presentation on "The Future of Islamic Finance: Beyond Legalism and Shari'ah Compliance" at the MI Global Research Forum in October. Additionally, the team actively disseminated Maqasid knowledge through various local platforms and events.

MI Indonesia







2023 witnessed Maqasid Institute Indonesia (MII) actively cultivating Maqasid awareness and research in the country. This journey unfolded through strategic partnerships, impactful courses, and workshops.

MII facilitated a visit by MI Global's Executive Team, fostering collaborations with renowned universities like Universitas Ahmed Dahlan, Muhammadiya University, UIN Sulthan Thaha Saifuddin Jambi, and Universitas Islam Indonesia. Four MoUs signed with these institutions cemented partnerships for Maqasid-based research, joint events, and academic program development.

MII members Dr. Addi Arrahman and Dr. Aulia Rahmat spearheaded a postgraduate course on Maqasid methodology at UIN Imam Bonjol, Padang. This intensive program, led by Prof. Dr. Jasser Auda, Dr. Zaid Barzinji, and Dr. Ildus Rafikov, equipped the postgraduate students and lecturers in the faculty of Islamic law with the new paradigm for research, thought, and action.

MII further hosted workshops and internal discussions on diverse research topics, fostering knowledge production and scholarly engagement. These activities, alongside Prof. Jasser Auda's keynote speech at the Islamic Psychology conference in July, amplified Magasid's impact on Indonesia's academic landscape.

Driven by these accomplishments, MII stands ready to continue its crucial role in shaping a vibrant Magasid scholarship ecosystem within Indonesia.

Our Educational Mission


- To cultivate individuals equipped with a holistic understanding of Islam, capable

The Graduate Studies track continues its legacy of nurturing scholars and researchers who make significant contributions to Islamic discourse and scholarship through foundational courses on Islamic worldview, Contemporary Challenges in Islamic scholarship, Maqasid methodology, the Qur'an Reflection program, Maqasid Approach to Hadith and additional elective courses in various social science disciplines.

The General Educational Program welcomes a diverse range of learners, providing them with the up-to-date information, critical thinking skills, and ethical foundations needed to engage with the challenges of today's world. This general track is designed for a broad spectrum of students/participants who would like to experience the purposeful, interconnected, and holistic nature of Islam through immersion into a three-part "Purposeful Living and Thinking" program, as well as selected specialized courses covering various social phenomena. Apart from the two programs in the general educational program, Maqasid Institute is also planning to implement the

"Qur'an Immersion Rihlah Program," which will be offered off-line and in-person as retreats or summer camps.

Flexible and Accessible Learning

We recognize that learning journeys take diverse forms. To cater to individual needs, we offer our programs through various formats, including:

- Synchronous online learning: Real-time interaction with instructors and fellow students.
- MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses): Asynchronous learning with live sessions for enhanced engagement.
- Blended learning: Combining online and face-to-face components for a flexible learning experience.
- Face-to-face learning: Traditional classroom setting for a close-knit learning environment.

Re-imagining Economics: A Transdisciplinary Approach

In 2024, the Maqasid Institute will launch "Re-imagining Economics: A Transdisciplinary Approach," a synchronous online course pioneering a paradigm shift in economic thought. The course centers on the Maqasid methodology, a transdisciplinary approach grounded in the Quran and Sunnah that offers a holistic understanding of economic phenomena.

The course equips students and researchers with the knowledge and tools to reconstruct economic thought through this new lens. It fosters a paradigm shift from mono-disciplinary to transdisciplinary analysis, enabling the application of the Maqasid framework to critical economic challenges and phenomena impacting our lives and the planet.

"Re-imagining Economics" represents a significant step towards a more comprehensive and ethically grounded understanding of economic phenomena. This initiative has the potential to reshape academic discourse and guide future research and practice in the field.

Maqasid Methodology for Islamic Psychology

This is an extension of our main Maqasid Methodology course, customized to the needs of Islamic psychology students, scholars, and practitioners. Led by Prof. Dr. G.H. Rassool and Prof. Dr. Bagus Ryono, this specialized course will provide a much-needed new outlook into the field of psychology from the Magasid perspective.

This customized course will help participants broaden their understanding of the field with practical application of the Maqasid Methodology to research, education, and practice in Islamic psychology.

Reading the Book of Nature: Appreciating the Signs of Allah (SWT)

This innovative course will provide participants with tools to comprehend the signs of the Creator in nature. Led by Shaikh Muhammad Foulds, an experienced falconer, raptor biologist, and human ecologist, this course will address the crisis of perception whereby millions of people, especially the youth, are disconnected from nature and do not appreciate its beauty and its profound impact on our lives. Participants will learn about and experience the inherent interconnectivity of all beings and learn how to think like an ecosystem.

Budget 2024

The budget for 2024 includes an emphasis on fundraising activities to build a stronger financial foundation for the institute. The budget also includes an expected increase in revenues from educational programs. Funding for the journal dropped significantly due to the change in focus to education and the need for a more sustainable revenue source. The grant for funding the Quran Tafsir project is expected to stop after this year, and new funding source(s) are needed.

A business development committee was created in September 20223 to review the institute's business models and finances. Some of the main recommendations of the committee were the need to price educational programs appropriately and to focus on English-speaking markets and audiences, primarily the US, UK, and Canada.
